The Teacher Incentive Allotment is a Texas state program established in statute that provides ongoing funding to districts to recognize and compensate highly effective classroom teachers. Through a state-approved local designation system, districts identify teachers based on student growth and evaluation data, and those designations generate additional, recurring funds dedicated primarily to teacher compensation.
